Lorrie Jancarz

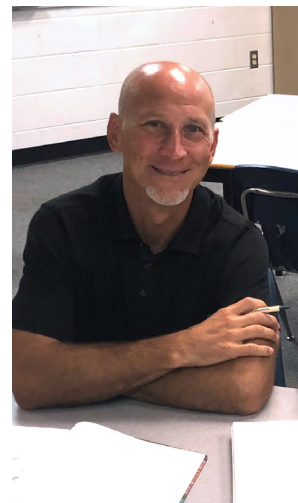
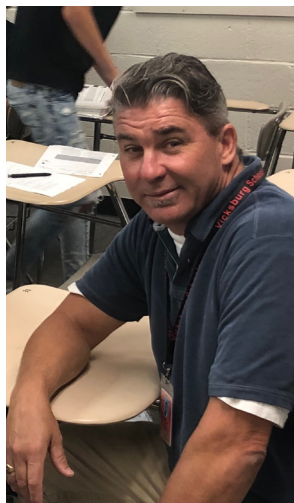

KRESA Millage on the Ballot November 5



Michigan needs more skilled workers for high-demand, high-tech and high-wage jobs. Too many young people are leaving school without the skills that employers desire, and without a plan or hope for the future. Together, we can change the course with a systemic redesign of Career and Technical Education (CTE) in Kalamazoo County.

The Kalamazoo RESA CTE proposal is the next step. On November 5, Kalamazoo County voters will decide on a one-mill, 20-year Career and Technical Education proposal to fund this work.
