Sunset Lake Elementary

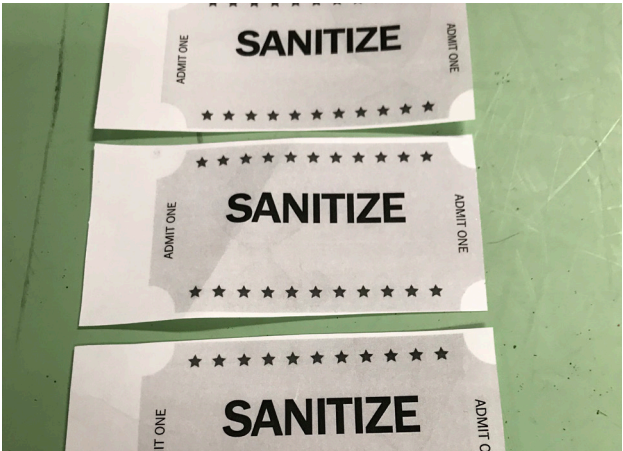

It's that time again for the school bells to begin ringing. This year is going to look so much different for students, their families, teachers and support staff, in and outside the classroom.


You will be met with teachers wearing masks, plexi-glass partitions in front of their desks and multiple hand sanitizing areas.

Paul Fleckenstein is a very happy and grateful parent, and recently expressed his thanks for the safety of his Kindergarten daughter to bus driver Gerri Gorsline. "If Mrs. Gorsline hadn't been paying attention, we wouldn't have Cindy today."

One recent icy afternoon, Cindy got off the bus and prepared to cross the street to her house when a speeding car came up behind the bus. It started to skid and then sped up, shooting past the bus. Mrs. Gorsline and Cindy were prepared, however, as the children on the bus had been taught never to cross without getting an ok from the driver. Mrs. Gorsline signalled for Cindy to wait, and tragedy was averted.

"In the fall Mrs. Gorsline worked hard to make sure the children followed directions," commented Cindy's mom, Evon. "She's very conscientious to be strict enough to demand attention from the children. We called about it because those drivers don't get enough recognition."

It's a difficult job, but Vicksburg's safety record proves that the districts skilled drivers care.

Vicksburg Community Schools Report; April, 1986. recognized Jerri for averting a near tragedy through strict guidance and keen readiness.

Most of us can recall the hustle of making it to the bus-on-time, and the sense of comfort as the school bus driver rolled up to your assigned stop, and the audible sigh of the air brakes indicating the start of your school day. Throughout the past five decades, this sound has been the norm to Mrs. Gorsline, or back in the day, "Mrs. G."

Jerri Gorsline started her working career as a surgical nurse. Yet as life and family happens, she found herself behind the wheel of a school bus back in February of 1971, a sensible fit for a mother of four. She hasn't looked back since. Her love of "routine, kids and driving" have kept her on VCS's payroll for 50 years! Some changes have occurred throughout

the past five decades; like manual to automatic transmissions and upgrades to school bus safety. Other than that, safety of students has stayed consistent, a regiment she emphatically drills into her passengers, especially the students who cross the road: wait in front of the bus until you are given the "go-ahead nod".

Sadly, drivers every day still disregard the flashing indicators warning them to stop, and Jerri has had her share of near mishaps. According to Transportation Director, Karen McKinstry, her "watchful eye and sharpness is still impeccable." Just last year, her alertness and quick reactions saved a potential accident from happening.

Back in 1986, Jerri was recognized for a

similar heroic act when she assessed a driver disregarding the bus at a student stop. She quickly alerted the student with a beep of the horn and gesture to stay put as the car careened by the school bus, student and cars stopped in the opposite direction.

Thank you for your unwavering years of service Jerri, as well as your dedication, and remarkable blend of passion and austerity, ensuring VCS passengers are safe. Not many of us can claim 50 years in one profession, but as Jerri says, "just love what you do."
