Vicksburg High School is ranked 108th within Michigan! U.S. News and World Report named VHS one of the top high schools in the nation, ranking in the top 40-percent of the country and third overall in Kalamazoo county.

The high ranking comes because students have the opportunity to take numerous Advanced Placement coursework and exams. The AP participation rate at Vicksburg High School is 45 percent.

A Summer Full of Construction Projects

It was another exciting summer of construction at two of our elementary schools!

All of the work happened thanks to the bond that our wonderful voters passed in 2020.

This summer, the second half of Sunset Lake and all of Indian Lake elementary school received upgrades.

Some of those improvements at the two schools include:

HVAC upgrades, including hydronic piping for boiler water distribution, air conditioning, and

control systems.

Electrical upgrades, including LED lighting and upgraded fire and smoke alarms.

Interior renovations, including new ceilings and painting.

Exterior upgrades including new windows, masonry, insulation, and exterior metal panels.

The final piece of our stadium improvements was also completed this summer. Crews added the Bulldog logo to the center of the football field.



Clay Target Team Scores Big at Championships



Congratulations to the Bulldog Clay Target Team, which had great representation at the state tournament and national championships to end their 2021-2022 season this summer.

The Bulldog Clay Target team competed in the Novice, JV, and Varsity divisions at the Michigan State Tournament at the Michigan Trap Shooting Grounds in Mason in June.

In the Varsity team competition, Vicksburg placed 27th out of 61

teams with the top five shooters scoring 443/500 for the team.

The overall team squad was led by David Standish (12th grader - 92/100), Bryce Sherwood (7th grader - 89/100), Anthony Knowles (11th grader - 89/100), Brady Young (9th grader-88/100), and Jackson Bowles (11th grader - 85/100). Both Standish and Young recorded one perfect 25 straight round each on the day. The highlight of the day was the Bulldog Novice team placing 3rd and making the podium. The top 5 novice shooters shot 359/500 on the day. The Novice squad was led by Drake Reitenour with an 8th place Novice overall finish (7th grader - 79/100), Brayden Dugray (9th grader - 75/100), Kevin Francisco (6th grader - 73/100), Xavier Cleveland (9th grader- 69/100), and Chance Breen (7th grader- 63/100).

In July, the Bulldog Clay Target Team competed in the USA Clay Target National Championships held in Mason, MI. Student athletes competed in both the individual and team events.

The Nationals included both Sherwood and Standish shooting perfect 25 straight rounds and a 50 straight round each! David dropped a target late in the third round of the individual event just missing a 75 straight.

The 2022 team event included 231 teams from across the U.S. The five member Bulldog Clay

Target Team was represented by Greyson Young (9th grader), Bryce Sherwood (7th grader), Tyler Richardson (10th grader), David Standish (12th grader), and Blake Sutherland (9th grader). In the prelims on Friday, Vicksburg's squad shot a 421/500 for a 205 out of 231 teams finish. The top 80 teams moved on to Sunday's Nationals team final.

The 2022 individual event included 1,716 Student athletes shooting for the title of National Champion. Vicksburg was represented in the individual prelims by David Standish, Greyson Young, and Tyler Richardson. David Standish was the lone finals qualifier for the Bulldogs with a 192nd place finish prelims score of 96/100. David finished the individual event in 278/1,716 with a final score of 189/200.

In prelims, Young finished at 1,203 with a 85/100 and Richardson finished at 1,598 with a 75/100. The top 401 student athletes advanced to Sunday's Nationals individual final.

Wildlife and Natural Resources Class at the Mill



If you've been to the Mill property this summer you may have seen the work of some of the Volunteers from the Wildlife and Natural Resources class took time out from their studying for final exams to plant American chestnut trees at the Mill site.

This is the beginning of a collaboration with MSU forestry PhD candidate Evan Farinosi to develop blight-resistant American Chestnut trees.

These trees were once the predominant tree in the eastern third of the U.S., and almost all succumbed to chestnut blight.

With climate change, the American chestnut will be ideally suited to grow in Michigan, so the development of blight-resistant stock is vital.

Thanks to the work of our students those trees are beginning to grow again on the Mill property.

Practicing Reading Skills During Summer School



Elementary summer school once again focused on the importance of reading!

Students taking part got visits from special guest readers and had reading nooks so they could curl up with books.

The students had a chance to brush up and improve their reading and math skills before heading off to the next grade level.

Summer school was held at Tobey Elementary, where the HVAC system was completely upgraded last summer, so staff, teachers and students stayed cool in the air conditioning.






