Great job to all the teams involved!


Better Business Bureau Scambusters at VHS

Indian Lake Peer Mediators Spread Peace

Peer Mediation gives students the opportunity to become leaders in the area of peaceful conflict resolution. Ms. Richeson, Indian Lake's school counselor, has been meeting with the Mediators on a weekly basis in order to guide them through interactive training to help the students gain confidence in their abilities as a mediator.

As an evidence-based restorative practice, peer mediation helps improve the school's overall climate and culture for students, staff, families, and the entire Vicksburg community.


