Carter plans to attend Albion University to play lacrosse and major in biology or biochemistry. He then hopes to attend University of Michigan for dental school.




Chase Willcutt

The cost per physical will be \$20 per athlete.


Sports physical forms may be found at vhsbulldogs.org or they can be picked up in the office at either school.
